1. What does it look like to be “Spirit-filled”? When someone describes themselves in this way, what do you expect they mean by it? Are all Christians “Spirit-filled”? Why or why not?

2. What kinds of things does the Holy Spirit do within the church and within the lives of Christians? What is the normal experience of Christians with the Holy Spirit?

3. What would it look like to put ourselves in a position to “hear from the Holy Spirit”? Are there any evidences in the Book of Acts of people seeking to hear from the Holy Spirit or an angelic visitation? Why or why not? Why do you think there is such an emphasis in modern Christian circles of hearing a special word from the Holy Spirit apart from Scripture?

4. Why do we struggle to believe God is working for our good when we can’t see it happening? How do we have more faith that He is and His plans are good for us?

5. Do you think Christians view the task of evangelism and other ministry as a duty to be done or a joy God invites them to experience? Why? What would help us view it as the latter more than the former?

6. Should churches be multicultural? Why or why not? Why aren’t churches multicultural? How would you seek to diversify the church in line with the look of the Kingdom of God?
