6. What two examples does James give to support his teaching that faith without works is dead (vv.21-26)?
7. Is James teaching that you have to have works in order to be saved? Is he teaching a works-based salvation? Is he teaching something different than Paul in Rom 4; Eph 2:1-10?
8. Take time to think through what James argues about Abraham. What texts from Genesis does James refer to? Why is the timeline on these two events important to James' argument?
9. Take time to think through what James argues about Rahab. What text in Joshua does James refer to? What is James arguing from the account of Rahab?
10. What does the following statement mean: "We are saved by faith alone, but a faith that saves is never alone."
